PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

DEAR MEMBERS:

As I near the half-way point in my tenure as president, I want to provide a mid-term report on the "State of the Association."

The three principal initiatives we have pursued this year have been to expand our educational programs, stem the decline in membership, and provide more opportunities for interaction among our members.

CLE. In the area of educational programs, we have expanded our CLE schedule to include 16 separate sessions, which either have been presented or are definite for the coming months. Seven such sessions—an FCBA record—will have been held by December 31. Our CLE committee reports that four more programs, which would bring the total to 20 for the year, are under discussion.

Com Law 101 will be presented as an afternoon session (on February 8), rather than as a day-and-a-half program. It is hoped this abbreviated schedule will attract busy young lawyers who would like to have attended in the past, but who found it difficult to spend two days out of the office.

Membership. We have assigned members of the Executive Committee to make calls or otherwise contact non-renewing members. We have sent e-mail reminders to those who did not renew. Through our Legislation Committee, we have contacted Hill staff to promote membership in the Association. A word-of-mouth campaign to recruit new members from the FCC has been undertaken. We have made membership applications available at our CLE sessions. We have encouraged our chapter co-chairs to promote the FCBA to lawyers in their regions.

These efforts have been successful. We have added 200 new members so far this year and at this point our overall membership is approaching last year's total of about 2700. This is in spite of the continuing contraction in the number of telecom and media firms employing communications lawyers.

Interaction. So far this year we have had one luncheon, featuring Mike Gallagher of NTIA, and one breakfast, with Dan Glickman, President and CEO of MPAA. Both were well attended. Commissioner Copps has agreed to speak at a luncheon on March 16, and other luncheons and breakfasts are in the planning stages. Oktoberfest with the FCC bureau chiefs drew a great crowd, as did the Charity Auction on November 18. Two more receptions are being planned. We want to continue to promote such events because, in addition to serving the immediate goals of the programs, they promote cohesiveness and collegiality among our members—core goals of the Association.

Administrative Matters. The FCBA is on schedule in meeting administrative goals. We expect to publish a new membership directory in February. We are well on our way towards implementing new association software, which will enable us to, among other things, process event and other registrations electronically by credit card. The full audit of our FY 2004 books is nearing completion, and we will be conducting a mid-year budget true-up for presentation to the Executive Committee in February. Preliminary indications are that we may be ahead of our budget targets at this point.

None of this year's initiatives could be accomplished without the support and assistance of the officers, Executive Committee members, committee co-chairs, professional staff and volunteers who serve the FCBA year after year. With their continuing assistance, I am sure I'll be able to provide positive a year-end report in June.

The transformation of telecommunications from an analog, narrowband network optimized for voice to a digital, broadband network optimized for data

traffic has created a myriad of challenges for businesses, policymakers, and academics alike. In enacting the Telecommunications Act of 1996, Congress instituted a regulatory model based on the traditional technology used to deliver voice telephony and largely did not grapple with the implications of the Internet. This failure, along with the challenges of reforming the legacy model of spectrum policy and "re-missioning" the Federal Communications Commission, have led many to suggest that it is time to re-write the Telecom Act.

This conference will examine the issues left largely unaddressed by the Telecom Act: how to grapple with the advent of broadband and Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP); how to reform spectrum policy; and how (and whether) the FCC can re-adjust its institutional mission. With a thoughtful array of leaders from academic, industry, and governmental circles, we believe that this conference will continue the Silicon Flatirons' tradition of encouraging "bolder thinking" in Boulder. Like its predecessors, the proceedings from this conference will be published in the Journal on Telecommunications and High Technology Law.

Engineering and Technical Practice Committee Hosts an FCC Lab Tour

On November 4, 26 FCBA members enjoyed an interesting and informative tour of the FCC's Engineering and Technology Laboratory, and lunch with FCC Lab personnel, in Columbia, MD. The tour was arranged by the FCBA's Engineering and Technical Practice Committee, led by ETP Committee co-chair Bruce Romano.

Lab director, Dr. Rashmi Doshi, and senior staff of the Lab spent the morning with the FCBA group. After a brief introduction on the role and functions of the Lab, the gang broke into small groups for individual presentations and demonstrations on RF safety/cell phone testing, the use of the Lab's new anechoic chamber, the Lab's responsibilities in the digital TV transition, the FCC's new broadband over

powerline initiative, and the Lab's general program to prevent harmful interference from digital devices. The staff demonstrated the interference effects of seemingly innocuous household items, and how they use several of their gizmos to identify and quantify problems.

The morning at the Lab ended with lunch with the senior Lab staff and a question and answer session that helped pull together the various elements of the morning's presentations.

The consensus of those participating in the tour was that the tour was enlightening and that the Lab staff was very generous with their time and lucid and patient in explaining the Lab's programs to the FCBA group. The Engineering and Technical Practice Committee is considering sponsoring a repeat of the Lab tour later in the year and would like to hear from FCBA members who are interested in participating.
