May 11th CLE - Master Class: Essentials of Engineering for Telecommunications Policy Reform

Presented by the Engineering and Technical Practice Committee and the Continuing Legal Education Committee

This Master Class, taught by distinguished engineer, consultant, and professor, **Dale Hatfield**, provides policy-makers with a unique opportunity to gain the insights Professor Hatfield has developed over his nearly four decades of experience in telecommunications policy and regulation. Dale will explain the essentials of network engineering and discuss how these network architecture principles intersect with developments in communications policy, including the debates about net neutrality that swirl around Washington corridors today.

This two and one-half hour CLE will be divided into two parts. The first session will consist of a basic technical tutorial for non-engineers. It will cover in an integrated fashion, and from a network architecture or system level viewpoint, topics such as analog and digital signals, the transmission requirements of different types of content – voice, data, image and video, the characteristics of different types of transmission media, the three types of switching – circuit, message and packet, the concepts and importance of bandwidth and latency, and the basic elements of wireless communications. It will conclude with a description of how the foregoing come together with the Internet Protocols to create the network(s) of the future. This refresher in basic principles will provide the backdrop for the second session.

The second session will, in turn, address how these latest technological developments fit into the long history of

technological advancements that have, over the past several decades, created not only significant challenges to policymakers and regulators, but offered significant opportunities for policy and regulatory reform as well. This will be done by tracing developments in two specific areas: the technological advancements underlying (1) the Federal Communications Commission's attempts to establish policy and regulation at the boundary between telecommunications and "data processing" and (2) the federal government's (i.e., the FCC and NTIA) efforts to reduce the rigidities in the policies and rules underlying the management of the radio spectrum resource. The first will start with a review of the developments that led to the launching of Computer Inquiry I four decades ago and the subsequent developments that underlie the current debates over "net neutrality." The second will start at roughly the same point in time with the developments that eventually led to the allocation and assignment of spectrum for trunked and cellular mobile radio systems and the subsequent developments in terms of software defined and "cognitive" radios that underlie current proposals to introduce more dynamic methods for managing the Nation's radio spectrum resource.

Dale Hatfield is well-known to many members of the FCBA . Over the years, he has generously donated his time to teach courses for the FCBA, including introductory seminars in engineering and more advanced seminars on spectrum issues. Dale currently serves as a key faculty and Advisory Board member of the Interdisciplinary Telecommunications Program at the University of Colorado in Boulder, following a distinguished career in government. At the FCC, Dale served as Chief of the Office of Engineering and Technology, Chief Technologist, and Chief of the Office of Plans & Policy. At the Commerce Department, he served as Assistant Secretary and Administrator of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA).
