In MEMORIAM

Stanley Bernard Cohen

Stanley Bernard Cohen, longtime member of the FCBA, longtime partner at Cohn and Marks LLP, and a former FCC staff member, died on November 26, 2006 at the age of 81. A native New Yorker, Mr. Cohen interrupted his stay at Brooklyn College to join the Army at the outset of World War II and earned two Purple Hearts. He survived the

Battle of the Bulge but was captured and sent with other American prisoners of Jewish descent to a prisoner-of-war camp near Berga, Germany to perform hard labor; Stan's numerous reports of the horrors of Berga are included in the book "Soldiers and Slaves" by Roger Cohen (no relation)(Knopf, 2005.) Stan returned to the U.S. to earn his bachelor's degree in 1947 at Brooklyn College, then his law degree in 1950 from Harvard Law School.

Stan moved to Washington upon graduation from Harvard Law and worked at the U.S. Department of Health,

Education and Welfare, then joined the staff of the Federal Communications Commission. He left the FCC to practice briefly on his own, associated for a time with attorney Leo Resnick. In 1955, he joined the Washington law firm formed 10 years earlier by Marcus Cohn and Leonard H. Marks, where he became a partner and eventually retired at the end of 1994.

Stan Cohen is survived by his wife of 58 years, Selma, and four children, Jody, Wendy, Carol and Paul, plus 10 grandchildren, and a brother.

FCC Enforcement Practice Committee

The FCC Enforcement Practice Committee is co-chaired by **Richard Firestone** of Arnold & Porter LLP, **Frank G. Lamancusa** of Bingham McCutchen LLP, **Christi Shewman** of the Wireline Competition Bureau, FCC, and **David Solomon** of Wilkinson Barker Knauer, LLP. The FCBA's FCC Enforcement Practice Committee provides members with a forum for information-sharing and discussion of the legal, regulatory and public policy issues key to practicing before the FCC's Enforcement Bureau. Communications practitioners and businesses, regardless of their area of expertise or market segment, will find themselves at one time or another focusing on how the FCC enforces the statutes and its rules. The Committee is there to serve as your resource for navigating that process. This year, the Committee's co-chairs are also working to broaden the mission of the Committee to include related enforcement topics of interest to members beyond practice before the FCC.

The Committee has already started an active agenda of brown bag lunches with government officials who make and implement enforcement policy, and practitioners experienced in enforcement matters. The first of these lunches was held on September 26th, and featured Enforcement Bureau Chief **Kris Monteith** and most of the Bureau's senior management team. Kris and the Bureau managers shared with a group of approximately 50 attendees their take on the FCC's current enforcement priorities, and responded to a broad range of questions from the audience. The Committee's second brown bag lunch was on November 28th. **Lydia Parnes**, Director of the FTC Bureau of Consumer Protection, and **Kris**

Monteith, Chief of the FCC Enforcement Bureau, spoke to members and answered questions about telemarketing enforcement issues, including the agencies' implementation and enforcement of TCPA, CAN-SPAM, Do-Not-Call, and Junk Fax rules. The Committee is planning a third lunch in the brown bag series in March.

In May, the Committee also plans to host an evening CLE that will cover not just the basics of enforcement practice, but also strategies and practical help for representing targets of FCC investigations. Chairman Robert E. Lee Scholarship and Internship Fund for Law Students

In 1993 the Foundation established a Scholarship and Internship Fund in memory of former Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Chairman Robert E. Lee, who passed away in April 1993 after serving on the FCC for almost thirty years. Chairman Lee served as a Commissioner of the FCC for 28 years and was instrumental in the early development of color television, among other contributions to federal communications policy.

For the 14th consecutive year, the Federal Communications Bar Association Foundation will award stipends to law students from its Chairman Robert E. Lee Scholarship and Internship Fund. In 2007, the Foundation will award five \$4,000 stipends to law students employed as unpaid summer interns in positions with the FCC and other government agencies or entities with jurisdiction over the communications industry (i.e., broadcasting, cable television, telephony, satellite, wireless, and information technology).

In addition, the Foundation will select one outstanding intern among the five as the "Max Paglin Intern," who will receive an additional stipend of \$600 for the summer. Mr. Paglin was the former General Counsel and Executive Director of the FCC, and the founder of the Golden Jubilee Commission on Telecommunications, which compiled a definitive legislative history of the Communications Act.

Applicants will be selected on the basis of: (1) a demonstrated interest in the communications field, (2) having secured or having pending, an unpaid summer position (internship) for at least 8 weeks in communications with a government agency, (3) dependence on financial assistance in order to accept the unpaid internship in a government agency involved in communications; and, (4) community activities. To the extent a recipient receives unanticipated funding for the unpaid internship, the FCBA Foundation's general policy is to reduce its scholarship awards by any amount that a recipient's total funding (including all sources) for the internship would otherwise exceed \$7,000.
