Sarbanes-Oxley and Corporate Compliance CLE Seminar - May 20

The Continuing Legal Education, Ethics, and Young Lawyers Committees are sponsoring a CLE to provide an overview of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act ("SOA"), SEC regulations, and other corporate compliance issues relevant to the telecommunications industry. services for business and consumer use. Widely known as one of the “Fathers of the Internet,” Cerf is the co-designer of the TCP/IP protocols and the architecture of the Internet. In December 1997, President Clinton presented the U.S. National Medal of Technology to Cerf and his partner, Robert E. Kahn, for founding and developing the Internet.

Prior to rejoining MCI in 1994, Cerf was vice president of the Corporation for National Research Initiatives (CNRI). As vice president of MCI Digital Information Services from 1982-1986, he led the

engineering of MCI Mail, the first commercial email service to be connected to the Internet.

During his tenure from 1976-1982 with the U.S. Department of Defense’s Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA), Cerf played a key role leading the development of Internet and Internet-related data packet and security technologies.

In addition to his work on behalf of WorldCom and the Internet, Cerf has served as a technical advisor to production for “Gene Roddenberry’s Earth: Final Conflict.” He also made a special guest appearance in May 1998. Cerf has appeared on television

programs NextWave with Leonard Nimoy and on World Business Review with Alexander Haig and Casper Weinberger. Cerf also holds an appointment as distinguished visiting scientist at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory where he is working on the design of an interplanetary Internet.

Cerf holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics from Stanford University and Master of Science and Ph.D. degrees in Computer Science from UCLA.
