HOW TO RENEW

1. LOG IN

Every member must log in to renew. To log in to your account, **click here** or go to **www.fcba.org** and click the Log In button.

The FCBA staff is still working remotely. For this reason, we strongly encourage you to pay online by credit card. We are still accepting payment by check, but the processing of check payments may be delayed.

IF YOU FORGET YOUR PASSWORD

If you don't know your password, please click on the "Forgot your Password?" link and follow the instructions to generate a new password. The system will then email you a link which you must activate to change the password.

Note that the link emailed to you is only good for one hour from the time you request it and that it can be only used once.

2. MAKE YOUR PAYMENT

To renew online by CREDIT CARD

- Once logged in, go to the **My Transactions** link. Here you can see a list of all your orders and invoices.
- Click on the **Pay Open Orders** button on the right side of the screen.
- Check off the box next to the order/invoice you wish to pay, click Next and follow the instructions to process your payment.

To renew by CHECK

- Once logged in, go to the **My Transactions** link. Here you can see a list of all your orders and invoices.
- Click the **View More** link under the **Invoice Details** column on the right side, then when the page opens click on **Print This Page** on the upper right side to print out the order.
- You must include the printed order with your check and mail both to the address on the order.

To pay for a group of renewals at one time

Some firms and companies prefer to pay for a group of membership renewals at one time with one check. There are two methods to do this:

1. Each individual member must log in and print out his/ her own order and submit it for payment through their internal channels. The firm or company must then send us all of the invoices at one time, along with the check.

2. The firm or company must send us a list of renewing members, each person's membership category and the associated fee, along with the check.

If you are paying for multiple renewals by credit card, you must pay each invoice individually online.

Get to Know an FCBA MEMBER

Jennifer Hindin

Jennifer Hindin is a partner and Chair of the Space and Satellite Group at Wiley. With all the news of innovations in satellite communications, I was delighted to connect with Jen. Looking back at her career progression, she pinpoints her time away as an undergraduate at Georgetown University as the moment when she became fascinated with the world of international policy. Like yours truly, Jen took the U.S.



State Department foreign service exam, but ultimately decided to go to law school, attending NYU's global law program. Jen and I spoke about how providential and unexpected some aspects of her legal career have been and how broad, compelling and intriguing the commercial, international and space work she's immersed herself in has been.

What attracted you to the field of communications?

I went to law school in part due to my interest in international law and when I graduated I joined Wiley's international trade and international communications groups. One of my first projects at the firm was working on the privatization of the satellite intergovernmental organization INTELSAT. As part of that project, I filed my first FCC license application and the rest is history. It turns out international communications law and policy was a great way to merge my initial interest in international law with satellite communications and communications policy.

Have things unfolded in your career more or less the way you planned?

A: I have been in private practice at Wiley for 25 years now—since the passage of the Telecom Act of 1996. I never planned for or anticipated this. I expected to join the government or a company after gaining a few years of experience at a law firm. However, I was surprised at the continued opportunities and interesting issues that came my way at Wiley, which looking back is actually quite consistent with the technology developments in communications and resulting new spectrum uses over this same time period. So much has happened with satellite technology; the capabilities seem to expand constantly, the time cycle to build and operate satellites keeps

shrinking (along with the size of the satellites themselves) and really meaty issues also keep proliferating.

What's the most interesting or challenging thing that you've done in your current position?

I hope the most interesting or challenging thing is yet to come. So far however, I'd have to say the FCC's C-band reallocation spectrum proceeding was the most challenging set of issues I've had to manage. To be successful in this complex undertaking required cooperation among many divergent aspects of the communications industry including satellite operators, media customers, wireless proponents and public interest groups.

Is there something interesting or someone who surprised or impressed you during your career and why?

Throughout my career I've been impressed by the number of and the success of women who practice communications law at all levels. It's encouraging to see that success and their ability to balance many demands. Two current examples are Acting FCC Chairwoman Rosenworcel and Doreen Bogdan-Martin (currently candidate to become the next Secretary General of the ITU), but of course there are many, many others that have inspired me over my career.

What do you enjoy reading?

I enjoy reading science fiction, books about space and summer romance novels. My nightstand currently has Test Gods (about Virgin Galactic's commercial space flight program) and How to Astronaut by Terry Virts. One of my favorite science fiction books was Seveneves by Neal Stephenson. And I've read every novel by Elin Hilderbrand, the majority of which are set on Nantucket Island. Her writing transports me out of my everyday life and into that of the folks in this idyllic island setting.

Can you share perspective on the pitfalls to avoid or other career advice for those who are just getting started in the communications field?

I recommend being kind to everyone. The communications legal industry is on the whole rather small. It's extremely important to treat attorneys and people from companies on the other side of any legal issue you encounter with absolute integrity and respect both in direct conversations and in written pleadings. At some point in your career, you may very well be aligned on a new issue with companies you previously opposed. And the impression you left in the past when you might have been adverse to them on a legal issue will be remembered.

I would also suggest not getting too focused on mastering a single issue area too early in your career. While I now focus primarily on satellite communications, my skills were developed through work on a broader range of issues including litigation, media and wireless matters. That breadth of experience provides something important to draw upon.

What is something interesting about you that people are not generally aware of that you're willing to share?

During college, I spent a year studying in Dakar, Senegal. My international affairs degree required study abroad in a foreign language and I was the

rebel who chose to fulfill this requirement in Africa instead of in Europe. This was at a time prior to mobile phones and certainly without any smart phones with Internet access. To call home, I had to arrive early at a government run call center and spend most of the day just waiting for an opportunity to have access to a telephone and then hope my parents were home to receive and pay for the call. This year abroad helped to spark my interest in international work generally, but also in the cause of improving access to communications

Another little known fact is that I enjoy fishing. I grew up fishing on Long Island NY. My Dad was a teacher with summers off and we had a small boat. I loved going out on the water with him and I learned as a teenager to filet a fish without leaving behind any bones. A couple summers ago I had the opportunity to fly fish in Colorado and hope to find more time to experience more of this type of fishing as well.

How has your life changed as a result of COVID-19?

A: The most positive change is that without the commute to an office in DC or the chaos of getting my two teenagers off to school I have had more time in the morning to focus on my health. I start each day with a two to three mile walk with my dog. It clears my head and has helped me improve my fitness. I typically walk to a local park where, after many years on a waitlist, I was given the opportunity during the pandemic to have a plot in the community gardens. I've spent my free time during COVID learning about gardening and digging in the dirt. I am enjoying my initial harvests of blueberries and snap peas with tomatoes, squash, and melons on the way. Both the dog walks and gardening have enabled me to meet neighbors and enjoy social interactions to substitute for those that I'm missing with my colleagues in the office.

How long have you been an FCBA member and what to you is the value of FCBA membership?

I have been an FCBA member for 25 years, ever since my first year practicing law in 1996. FCBA membership is valuable in so many ways that it is literally not possible for me to list just a single one. I have made friendships through the FCBA, particularly through attending the social activities and annual seminars. I've learned more about important communications substantive issues through participation in CLEs, and I received one of my first leadership opportunities co-chairing

the International Telecommunications Committee. I've gained confidence speaking on panels in front of other FCBA members who in large part are more like friends and family than an intimidating audience. Finally, I have to say that I feel good when contributing to the FCBA Charity Auction and Foundation to improve educational opportunities for scholarship recipients each year.

General Counsel – The SBE General Counsel is an independent contractor to the Society of Broadcast Engineers, Incorporated (SBE), retained by the Board of Directors of the Society. The General Counsel reports directly to and consults with the SBE Executive Director regularly, and consults also directly with the SBE President. The General Counsel will advocate for and represent both the Society of Broadcast Engineers and the Ennes Educational Foundation Trust, both being District of Columbia non-profit entities.

The General Counsel should be a member of the Bar of the District of Columbia and/ or a surrounding State, and will have offices

within or near the District of Columbia. The principal function of the General Counsel will be to provide Federal telecommunications law advice, counsel and advocacy for SBE and the interests of SBE's membership before the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). Specifically, the General Counsel will assist the President and the Executive Director in advocating at the FCC the policies determined by the Board of Directors and the Board's Executive Committee. This will include preparing and filing pleadings, petitions, comments, reply comments and other input documents in FCC rulemaking and related regulatory proceedings, and participate as directed by the Executive Director and the Board of Directors in other FCC proceedings, including rulemaking and adjudicatory proceedings. The General Counsel will also advocate the telecommunications law interests of SBE and its membership before Federal agencies other than the FCC, including but not limited to the National Telecommunications Information Administration, the Department of Defense, The National Aeronautics and Space Administration and the Federal Aviation Administration.
