We are driven by one of our experienced volunteers and the trip to distribution location takes about 10-15 minutes.

We serve about 30-75 people per visit including a few mothers who come for food for their families. The area is well patrolled by police. The food distribution is conducted in an efficient, calm and orderly fashion and many of the people we serve are quite appreciative of our efforts. Once we serve all of the food, we do a clean up of the immediate area. Total time for the distribution takes about one hour and we usually return to Martha's Table by or before 6:30 p.m.

In MEMORIAM

Richard M. Rindler 1944-2009

Richard M. Rindler, a former partner in the Telecommunications Media & Technology practice at Bingham McCutchen LLP, passed away suddenly on August 2, 2009. Rich retired from the practice of law in 2007 to travel and pursue his many and varied other interests, but remained close to the many former colleagues and clients with whom he practiced for many years.

Rich's practice included litigation, regulatory, transactional and legislative matters. He was involved in the creation, financing, development, regulation and restructuring of telecommunications companies and he represented their interests in proceedings before the Supreme Court, numerous U.S. Courts of Appeals and District Courts, the FCC, and state courts and regulatory commissions. He played a key role on behalf of Metropolitan Fiber Systems (MFS) in developing a regulatory state public utility commission strategy for opening the local telecommunications market to competition and in formulating groundbreaking (pre-1996) petitions for FCC inquiry and rulemaking to establish local interconnection rules and regulations.

Rich also represented MFS and numerous other competitive local exchange carriers in key FCC proceedings arising out of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, having been extensively involved in drafting of the Act and its implementation at the FCC and in more than 30 states. He was particularly known for his expertise in complex intercarrier compensation issues.

Rich was a partner at Swidler Berlin LLP for 17 years prior to its merger with Bingham McCutchen in 2006. Prior to joining Swidler Berlin, he was a partner in the Washington office of Pepper Hamilton & Scheetz, where his practice concentrated on the application of antitrust law to regulated industries – experience that he subsequently used to great effect in the emerging competitive telecommunications environment. Previously he was an attorney with the Federal Trade Commission. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1966 from McGill University and his Juris Doctor degree in 1969 from Georgetown University.

Rich was warm and caring person and excellent attorney who selflessly gave his time and attention to others. He was a wonderful mentor, role model and friend to all of the many attorneys with whom he worked over the years and was greatly appreciated and esteemed by his clients. He was unfailingly respectful to and respected by adversaries with whose positions he disagreed.

Rich is survived by his daughter, Sara Adland, of Washington, D.C. A memorial service will be held at 2:00 p.m. on September 24, 2009, at the Cosmos Club, 2121 Massachusetts Avenue, Washington, D.C.

Harry M. "Chip" Shooshan III

Long-time communications attorney/ consultant and FCBA member Chip Shooshan died on July 19 in Bedford, New Hampshire, at age 63, after a long illness. He had amyloidosis.

Chip was born in Wilmington, Delaware, and grew up in Bethesda, Maryland. He graduated from the Landon School in 1964 and from Harvard University, magna cum laude, in He began his career in 1968. Washington in 1969 as an assistant to Congressman Torbert Macdonald (D-Mass) and later was Staff Director for the Subcommittee on Communications and Power of the House Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee. While working in Congress he attended Georgetown University Law School, from which he graduated in 1975. That year he became Staff Director and Chief Counsel for the new and separate Subcommittee on Communications.

Chip left the Hill in 1980 to form the consulting firm of Shooshan & Jackson, with Charles L. Jackson. In 1989 Shooshan & Jackson became a part of National Economic Research Associates. In 1992 Chip became a principal of Strategic Policy Research, a telecommunications and public policy consulting firm. In 2006, he joined Analysys Mason, a consulting firm specializing in telecom, IT and media.

Chip was the author of numerous studies and articles dealing with various aspects of communications and telecommunications policy. He testified before several congressional committees, the FCC and numerous state commissions with jurisdiction over telecommunications. He also testified as an expert witness in litigation and in proceedings before the Copyright Arbitration Royalty Panel. His clients over the years included cable, telecommunications and broadcast companies, as well as industry associations. Chip's many published articles include one in the May 1998 Federal Communications Law Journal titled "A Modest Proposal for Restructuring Federal the Communications Commission."

Chip also was an adjunct professor at Georgetown University Law School, from 1978 until 1991.

According to Chip's long-time friend and colleague Charles Jackson, one of Chip's great strengths was his ability to work with people from all disciplines. He could discuss economics with economists and network design with engineers. This talent allowed Chip to bring together the work of various specialists and communicate the result effectively to non-specialists.

Survivors include his wife of 13 years, Alisa Hamilton Shooshan, and their daughter; two daughters from his first marriage; and three grandchildren.
