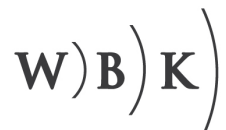
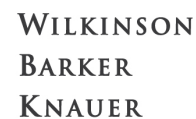

FCBA's DIVERSITY PIPELINE PROGRAM

A New Class Of Enthusiastic DPP Law Students Is Ready To Take On TMT Law

This April, the FCBA's Diversity Pipeline Program (DPP) hosted a graduation ceremony for its third class of students that completed the 2023 TMT Law and Policy Certificate Program. This year, 31 students from law schools throughout the country graduated from the intensive six-week academic program. Former Acting FCC Chair Mignon Clyburn delivered an inspiring keynote address to the group of graduates and guests. She emphasized the "boundless experiences and innovative points of view our sector needs for more sustainable public policy decisions are represented, right here, in this class."

The TMT certificate **program** featured remarks and lectures from some of the most well-known and influential names in technology, media, and telecom (TMT) law. In addition to the substantive coursework, graduates gained hands-on experience by leading mock ex parte meetings, and other practical knowledge such as communications and advocacy skills that many of them will carry into their paid legal internship this summer at DC-area law firms, trade associations, and TMT companies. The DPP pairs each student with an FCBA mentor and provides skills and career strategy sessions throughout the summer.

The DPP Committee's purpose is to advance the mission of the FCBA-The Tech Bar by fostering meaningful diversity and inclusion in the TMT legal profession. It aims to do that by attracting, developing, training, and supporting diverse, first-year law students from groups historically underrepresented in the legal profession and by encouraging their interest and participation in TMT law and policy.

In just three years since its inception, the DPP has matched 73 students from more than 25 law schools with 33 employers. Our support doesn't end once the summer is over; the FCBA continues to support students throughout their time in law school and as they become new lawyers. To celebrate three years of successful programming and our students, the DPP co-chairs and employers, and other invited DPP friends and guests, gathered with current and former DPP interns and TMT certificate recipients on June 8 for

our inaugural DPP reunion. We would like to extend our sincere thanks to Hogan Lovells for hosting and sponsoring this event, as well as all of our other employer participants and sponsors listed on **page 3** for their ongoing support of the DPP.

The success of the DPP is attributable to the many participating employers, speakers, mentors, and supporters of the program. The Diversity Pipeline Committee extends its ongoing gratitude to the FCBA membership and to each individual and organization that continues to make this program possible.

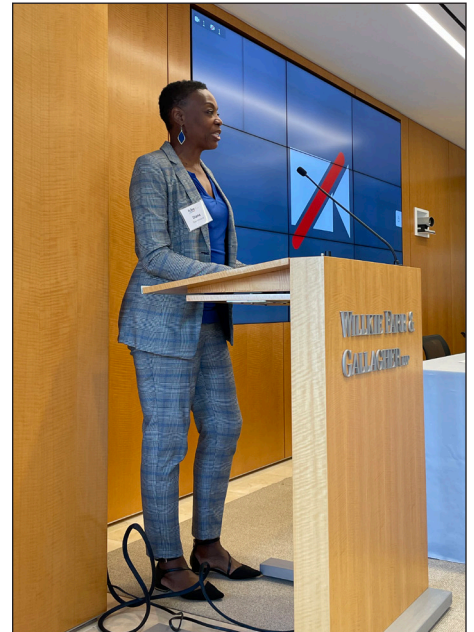
