The Deputy Division Chief position offers the opportunity to work with talented division staff to investigate and address violations of the Commission's regulations. SED's functions include investigating and taking appropriate enforcement action on matters such as orbital debris or satellite operation outside its authorization, 911 system failures, environmental issues with tower construction, and equipment marketing. James K. Edmundson, Jr. (1938-2023)

Retired communications attorney James K. Edmundson, Jr. died on October 8, 2023. He was 84.

Jim began his legal career at the FCC in 1963, as a trial attorney. After a few years with the Commission, he went into private practice, initially with the firm Fly, Shuebruk, Blume & Gaguine. He continued in private practice with several other firms until his retirement in 2006. In the heyday of FCC hearings involving licenses for broadcast stations – including “comparative” hearings for licenses for new stations and hearings involving license renewal applications – Jim was one of the premier practitioners. A real trial attorney.

Jim’s interest and skill in trial work came naturally. His father was a prominent trial attorney in Beckley, West Virginia, where Jim was born on December 24, 1938.

Jim graduated from Woodrow Wilson High School in Beckley and then attended West Virginia University, from which he graduated in 1960. He was a member of the Sigma Nu fraternity. Jim stayed on at West Virginia University for law school, graduating in 1963. He was a member of the West Virginia Law Review and served on its Board of Editors.

In addition to Fly, Shuebruk, Blume & Gaguine, Jim’s career included stints at Tepper & Edmundson; Kenkel Barnard & Edmundson; Gardner Carton & Douglas; Smithwick & Belendiuk; and, during the last few years of his career, Edmundson & Edmundson, in partnership with his wife, Ellen Mandell Edmundson. Jim and Ellen first met during a deposition for a comparative hearing proceeding, in 1989.

Jim was a member of the FCBA throughout his career and participated in its Mass Media and Adjudicatory Practice committees. In addition, he was part owner of a radio station and a partner in licensees of MMDS facilities.

Jim was very active in West Virginia University alumni activities in the DC area. He was a founder of the annual WVU Crab Feast for the National Capital Area, which began in his backyard more than 40 years ago and now attracts hundreds of attendees. He also established a scholarship at WVU.

Jim was a long-time resident of Alexandria, Virginia, and served a term as President of the Marina Towers Condominium there. He was an active member of Calvary Presbyterian Church and Fairfax Presbyterian Church. Upon retiring, he and Ellen bought a vacation home near Beckley, West Virginia. During retirement, Jim enjoyed spending time there with family and friends.

In addition to his wife Ellen, Jim is survived by four children from a prior marriage, eight grandchildren and one great granddaughter. A memorial service is being planned.
