PRESIDENT'S Message

"Thank you, FCBA!"

At the FCBA Annual Luncheon last month, recipients of FCBA Foundation scholarships repeated this phrase many times. They also told us about the opportunities that these scholarship funds will help them unlock. It was a powerful moment for everyone in the room.



The phrase, "Thank you, FCBA" also reflects my own feelings. The FCBA has given much to me, both professionally and personally. 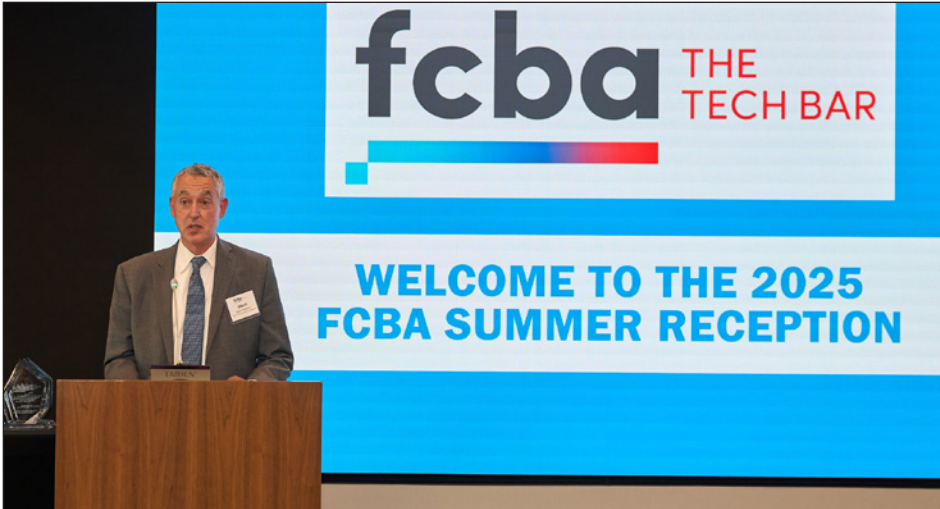
